Goal: To provide a basic knowledge of the fashion history from the Gothic period to today.

Description: Fashion and style have experienced dramatic changes throughout the history of Western civilization. This presentation identifies significant historic fashion trends from the Gothic period to today, analyzes the social influences and values affecting fashion, and describes fashionable items in each historical period for both men and women. Students will also learn the impact of celebrities and designers on fashion.

Objectives:

1. To identify significant historic fashion trends from the Gothic period to today.
2. To analyze the social influences and values affecting fashion.
3. To describe fashionable items in each historical period for men and women.
4. To discuss the impacts of celebrities and designers on fashion.

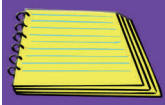

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Lesson Plan

Class 1: Pass out the *Fashions of Yesterday & Today Vocabulary Handout*. Show *Fashions of Yesterday & Today - Gothic Period to 19th Century*. Follow the segment with its *Assessment*. Instruct students to complete the *Fashions in the Past Activity*.

Class 2: Begin by briefly reviewing the previous segment. Show *Fashions of Yesterday & Today - 20th Century to Present*. Remind students to continue using the *Vocabulary Handout*. Follow the segment with its *Assessment*. Have the students complete the *Movies & Fashion Activity*. Introduce the *Designer Profile Project* and allow the rest of the class time for students to work.

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Lab Activities

Fashions in the Past

Directions:

Have students choose a particular time period in the past (from Gothic period to 19th century). Student will list the most iconic fashion items for the specific time period and find corresponding images on the Internet to describe the items. Students will print the pictures and share them with the class.

Movies & Fashion

Directions:

Students will choose a specific time period in the 20th century. Have students list three or four movies which were set during the particular time period. Instruct students to analyze the costumes in the movie. Students will discuss how the costumes fit the fashion of the chosen time period.



Projects

Designer Profile

Directions:

Have each student choose one of the most influential fashion designers of the 20th century. Students will research the fashion designer and create a profile to portray him or her. The profile should include the basic information about the designer, his fashion styles and concepts, representative works and how he or she impacted fashion of the time.

Fashion Invention

Directions:

Each student will research an invention which contributes to today's apparel manufactory. Create a Microsoft® PowerPoint® presentation to introduce the invention. The Microsoft® PowerPoint® should include the name of the invention, information on the inventor and how the invention is used in today's apparel industry.
